## A COVID-19 Update

Would you like to keep or make an appointment but have concerns about coming to the office?  
Telehealth may be for you!

A Woman's View is continuously working to prioritize the safety of our patients, providers and staff first and foremost. If you have an upcoming appointment and would like to convert to a Telehealth appointment (appointment by video/audio using a smartphone, laptop or home computer), please give our office a call. Many of our appointments that do not require 'hands on' examination can be completed from the comfort and safety of your own home.

CDC guidelines recommend individuals over the age of 65 or those with multiple underlying health conditions to practice caution with their daily activities and reduce exposure where possible. If you are a patient that falls into this high risk category and would like to reschedule your appointment to telehealth or move to a later date, please contact our scheduling department.

If you are coming to the office, we ask that you follow these guidelines:

- If you're running a fever or exhibiting any symptoms, please call our office prior to arriving for your appointment.
- In order to limit exposure for everyone, we request that all non-OB patients refrain from bringing anyone with them to the office, **including children**, unless a patient requires a caregiver's presence. OB patients may bring one person – spouse, significant other or parent.
- **ALL PATIENTS**, and anyone who accompanies them to the exam room, must wear a mask. Please note that scarves, bandannas and gaiters are not considered to be acceptable face coverings. Anyone who does not have a face mask will be supplied one upon check-in. Masks must be worn throughout the entire visit. **Anyone unable to wear a face mask for the duration of their visit will be rescheduled to a later date.**
- All patients will be asked screening questions and will have their temperature taken at check-in.
- Patients will be asked to wait in their cars after check-in until their room is ready. An assistant will call and take patients directly to their exam rooms.
